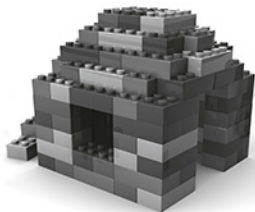

JOBS WITH ANIMALS: DOG GROOMER**INTRODUCTION**

Dog groomers keep dogs' coats in good condition. If you love dogs and want a skilled job, this job could be ideal for you.



First, a dog groomer talks to the owner and finds out about their dog. Then he / she cuts the dog's coat with electric clippers. Next the groomer washes and dries the dog's coat. Finally, he / she trims the coat with scissors. Sometimes the groomer cuts the dog's claws and cleans its teeth and ears.

To be a dog groomer, you need to:

- handle dogs firmly but gently
- be able to calm nervous dogs
- be patient and careful
- be fit and strong (when grooming large dogs)
- have good communication and customer care skills



New groomers can earn around \$7500 to \$9500 a month. In a dog grooming salon, groomers usually work about 10 hours a day, six days a week.

The most important requirement is that you like dogs and have some experience of them. You can learn to be a dog groomer by finding work with an experienced groomer and training on the job. Another option is to do a course at a college before you look for work.

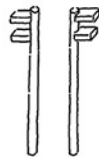

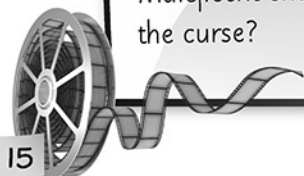

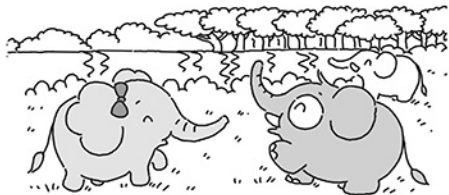

Planet Earth

The physical world

Tornadoes



Tornadoes are strong, dangerous winds caused by powerful thunderstorms.

Tornadoes move very quickly — the fastest ones reach speeds of over 300 miles (483 km) per hour. They can last from a few seconds to over an hour. The average time is ten minutes.

- 5 Although tornadoes happen in many different parts of the world, most of them occur in the United States of America. Here there are around 1,200 tornadoes, killing about 60 people, every year.



- 10 Tornadoes are very strong and can pick up cows, cars and even houses. In 1931 a tornado in Mississippi lifted a 75,000 kg train and threw it 25 metres from the track.



Volcanoes

Volcanoes are openings in the Earth, often at the top of a mountain. When a volcano erupts, lava (very hot liquid rock) comes out through the hole. This lava kills everything it touches because it is incredibly hot — with temperatures as high as 1,200°C.

There are three types of volcanoes:

- active — may erupt at any time
- dormant — may erupt but has not done so for a long time
- extinct — dead and will not erupt again

There are around 1,500 active volcanoes in the world today. Of these, 80 are under the sea. The world's biggest volcano, Tamu Massif, is in the ocean between Japan and Hawaii. It covers 120,000 square miles, making it more than 280 times as big as Hong Kong.

Scientists estimate that volcanoes have killed about 200,000 people in the last 500 years. Although they are deadly, 1 in 20 people live in the 'danger zone' of a volcano. This is because after the lava cools, it leaves fertile land, which is good for growing plants.

Yesterday over 2000 people celebrated the start of the New Year by taking part in the annual Barefoot Walkathon. This event has taken place each year since 2012 and raises money for people in East Africa. Samson Leung from the charity World Aid explained why: 'Because of war in this area, about a million people became refugees. They were afraid so they left their homes and are living miles away in tents.' The volunteers paid a minimum of \$600 each (\$1,600 for a family) to join the Walkathon; some raised a lot more than this. World Aid plans to use this money to provide much-needed food, shelter and clothes, as well as medicine to help the refugees.

Most of the refugees have only the clothes they were wearing when they ran away. Many do not even have shoes. By walking barefoot, Hong Kong people could experience life as a poor refugee, if only for a short time. They walked uphill for about 45 minutes on a road which is usually full of cars. It was an uncomfortable experience, as eleven-year-old Ivana told us, 'The road was rough and hurt my feet. The soles of my feet were really dirty.' However, Ivana learnt an important lesson. 'I am really lucky to have shoes. In future I won't buy so many shoes. I'll save money to help others,' she said.

When the walkers reached their destination, they could participate in activities which helped them to understand how the refugees lived — cooking over an open fire, collecting water and spending time in a cardboard box as small as a dog kennel. Peter Wong, a primary school teacher, said, 'This is such a meaningful experience. I feel closer to the refugees because I have lived as they do every day.' Unlike the refugees, the lucky walkers could put their socks and shoes back on and return home. Hopefully the money they have raised will mean that the refugees of East Africa can soon do the same.

What is La Tomatina?

La Tomatina is a Spanish festival. It is also known as the 'tomato fight festival'. It has been celebrated since 1945.

When and where is La Tomatina celebrated?

It is celebrated on the last Wednesday of August in a town called Bunol in Spain. Every year about 20,000 people from different parts of the world come to Bunol to join the festival!

What do people do at La Tomatina?

Before the tomato fight begins, a ham is placed on top of a tall pole in the town square. The pole is covered with soap so it is difficult to climb. People try to climb the pole to get the ham. After this has happened, a huge water gun is fired and the tomato lorries start to arrive, honking their horns.

The tomatoes are grown especially for the festival — they are cheaper than other tomatoes because they do not taste as good. About 54,000 kg of tomatoes are used every year. Everyone grabs tomatoes, squashes them so that they are softer and throws them at one another! Eye masks, gloves and old clothes are worn because it can be very messy. After an hour or two, the water gun is fired again and the fight comes to an end. Everybody helps to clean up the streets with water. Believe it or not, the streets are cleaner because of the tomatoes!

There are just a few rules:

- 1 Give way to the tomato trucks.
- 2 Hard tomatoes really hurt. Squash the tomatoes before throwing.
- 3 Throw only tomatoes.

Sunflower School Reading Club Report

December 2015

Introduction

The Sunflower School Reading Club was five years old last month so we decided to do a survey to find out what students think about it. We are sorry to report that membership of our club has fallen in recent years. As Figure 1 shows, only 85 pupils are members this year.

More findings

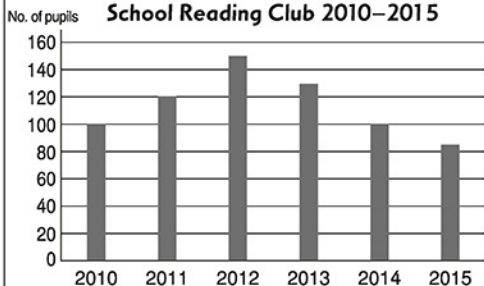


Figure 2: Reasons for not joining Sunflower School Reading Club

We talked to pupils from Primary 1 to Primary 6 to try to find out why they did not want to join the Reading Club. They gave a number of different answers but, as Figure 2 shows, the most common response was that they were not interested in books.

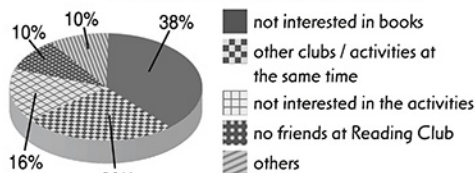
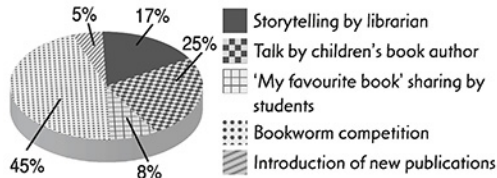


Figure 3: My favourite activity at last year's Reading Week

16% of pupils said they were not interested in the activities of our Reading Club, so we asked pupils which activities they enjoyed during last year's Reading Week. These results are shown in Figure 3.

It was clear from these results that the bookworm competition was very popular. One student said that we should have a book quiz with teams from each house. The winning team could compete against teams from other schools. Some students said that they prefer reading books that have been made into films, such as the Harry Potter series.

Recommendations

We should try to increase the membership of Sunflower School Reading Club. We can do this by organising more fun activities, such as competitions. We can also arouse pupils' interest in reading by promoting books that are also films. We should also make sure that our activities do not clash with those of other school clubs and teams.

Figure 1: Membership of Sunflower School Reading Club 2010–2015

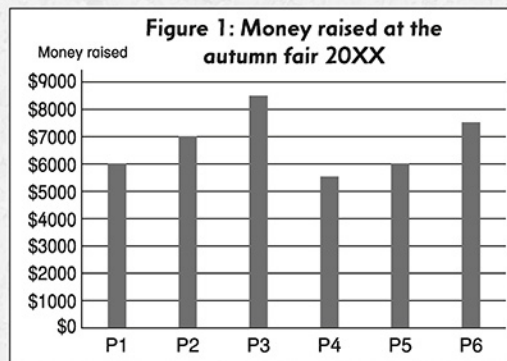
